## Celebrating: Faith, Family, and Healing

We're excited to invite you to our Seventh Annual Christmas Banquet this December 14th, where we will be presenting our premier speaker, Leah Vance Simpson.

Leah longs for people to see and understand the joy of embracing every day by understanding God's story. She received her degree in public speaking/communications and spent time working in education, broadcast sales, and local government. As a Christ follower, she is enthusiastic about all things home and family. Spiritual formation, family, mental and emotional health, domestic proficiency, and hospitality all provide motivation for Leah's content on a podcast, blog, and in two books. She spent over 25 years homeschooling her five children, as well as tutoring other children.

Leah writes a weekly blog, *Nurturing My Nest*, and hosts a companion weekly podcast, *Embrace Your Everyday*, with her husband, Tim. Both *Nurturing My Nest: Intentional Homebuilding and Custom Built Education*, and *Hum of the Home: Routines and Rhythms of Homemaking*, offer inspiration and practical ideas.

In addition to the full-time work of educating her own children, she has served as a Bible teacher, the leader for children's conferences in India, coached students to national wins in speech and debate, directed a large Awana Bible memory group, founded a field-trip program, and pioneered several sizable educational groups. The primary spiritual influence in Leah's life was her mother, Aloha. After many years of missionary work, the normally positive Aloha found herself struggling with discouragement, despair, and depression compounded by menopausal symptoms. In 2002 after ten years of very little sleep, severe weight loss, breast cancer, and two psychotic episodes, led to being admitted for a 15-day stay in a psychiatric ward. This prompted Leah to reach out to Donna Robart at the Women's Refuge.

By God's kindness, Aloha spent the next three months at the Refuge. Her grace journey is one of incredible healing and renewed joy. Aloha's family feels that the work done by God at the Refuge gave them an additional 18 years with their mother. In the following years, the Vance family has cheerfully given to encourage the ongoing work on the Refuge.
