## ABOVE ALL ELSE GUARD YOUR HEART ... for everything you do flows from it Prov. 4:23

I was scared. I imagined the gigantic shot of novocaine numbing the area, the scalpel looming large in my mind. Months before, my adorable toddler had broken glass, shattering pieces all over her and myself. In desperation to protect her and clean up the mess, I ground a sizeable piece into the base of my thumb. Not able to get it out, I stuck a band-aid on it, hoping to ignore it.

Maybe it will work its way out. That's what splinters usually do, right? So, for three months I padded the area with a band-aid to make it more bearable, hoping it would go away. The pain wasn't that bad; so what if I had limited use of my thumb, I rationalized? Finally, I got up the nerve to see a doctor who, with a quick shot and a sharp scalpel, dug out a large piece of green glass. Instant relief! What was the big deal I wondered? A little momentary pain for the full use of my thumb? A no-brainer!

Did I learn that lesson from years ago? Not really. A shard of glass in my thumb is nothing compared to the shards in my heart.

Many years after this incident, I realized I needed heart surgery. Not the kind from a cardiologist but the kind only the Holy Spirit can do.

Though I was a Christian, the challenges of just living

life in my own strength, had depleted me of all joy and peace. Trials and tribulations left me heavily burdened. There were so many tiny slivers of glass in my heart, slivers deep and painful; many I didn't even recognize had calloused my heart. I was tired of being tired. I was not experiencing the joy and peace that Jesus Christ promises. I was stuck and didn't know how to get unstuck. I needed help and when a friend told me about the Women's Refuge, I jumped at the chance. There, I found the freedom I so desperately needed through this remarkable ministry.

Is it possible you have shards of glass in your heart? Have you been putting band-aids on your heart ignoring hurt, fear, and even depression? Has your walk with God gone stale? Are you looking for a fresh start?

Then the Women's Refuge is the place for you. A quiet place of safety and comfort while renewing your relationship with the God of all comfort, who has never abandoned you. He wants to set you free to walk with Him daily in His peace and joy.
