

BEAUTY IN BROKENNESS

intsugi is the Japanese art of repairing broken pottery. In the act of restoring the pottery, its shards are glued back together with a mixture of lacquer dusted with powdered gold, silver, or platinum. What results is a bowl or a vase transformed into an even more beautiful object. The breakage and repair are treated as part of the history of the object rather than something to be disguised.

Isn't Kintsugi a metaphor for how God takes our broken lives that were once beautiful and transforms them into a greater work of art displaying His glory?

Each of us was originally meant to be a beautiful and unique creation of God. We were *"fearfully and wonderfully made."* Psalm 139:14.

But we broke that beautiful work of God with sin resulting in damage to our lives, souls, and hearts. "We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all." Isaiah 53:6. Not only have we broken ourselves, but we have broken others and others have broken us with thoughts, words, and actions.

Yet our lives are not to be cast off, thrown away, or thought to be now worthless like a piece of broken pottery. We cannot fathom what He is willing and able to do for us in our broken state. *"For the Lord desires to heal and to save."* Jeremiah 17:14. And from Psalm 147:3, *"He heals the broken hearted and binds up their wounds."*



As an artisan repairs a pot or vase with the Kintsugi method of lacquer and precious metals, so God "glues" our lives back together. 2 Corinthians 3:18 reads, "And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into His likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit."

There is beauty in brokenness, for God repairs the brokenness in our lives with Himself, His Son, and the Holy Spirit. Then beauty is reflected and revealed in our lives, making us more beautiful than ever before.
